- Native dye

OREGON Grape

- Edible berries
- Native Food/Plant
- · Yellow flowers
- Use stem for dye
- Sharp holly leaves

SALAL

- Edible berries
- Bell flowers
- Smooth, oval leaves
- Likes some shade
- NativeFood/Plant

RED Huckleberry

- Edible berries
- Grows on stumps, often
- Pink flowers
- NativeFood/Plant

FIRE WEED

- Pink Flowers
- Long, thin pods
- Fluff in pod
- Native Weaving/Food Plant

STINGING Nettle

- Ridged leaves
- Grow fast
- Rash or pain if touched
- Native
 weaving,
 food, cords,
 medicine

Urtica dioica



SWORD FERN

- Loves rain
- Lives on forest floor
- Native Plant
- Spores under leaf
- Long, thin fronds

LADY FERN

- Yellow-green
- Likes wet woodlands
- Native Plant
- Spores under leaf
- Feather-like fronds

WESTERN RED CEDAR TREE

- Flakey, red outer bark
- Pliable, moist inner bark
- Many Native uses
- Insect repellant

Thuja plicata



HORSE TAIL

- Stores water
- Can eat part of young plant
- Like wet ground
- Tuber growing
- Scouring stem

DOUGLAS FIR

- One of tallest trees on earth
- Tips used for tea/food
- Big cones
- Native PNW
- Pine family
